Purpose of Workshop

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the workshop participants will:

- Be aware of the baseline technology used within FoNS; Blackboard, Teams, Panopto.
- Have an awareness of how various technologies can be used for teaching within the Faculty and what is good practice.
- Have an understanding of how learning technologies support different modes of teaching;
 classroom, hybrid, fully online, tutorial and laboratory environment.
 - o to be able to create a learning experience to meet module pedagogical and technical needs.
- Be aware of who the primary contacts are in their department to obtain further information and assistance with implementing these technologies in their teaching
- Be aware of how to get training directly from your department, AV Team, Ed Tech Lab or EDU.
- Be familiar with the additional online resources available: Ed Tech wiki, EDU and ICT webpages.

- Develop an understanding of evaluation how to evaluate active learning.
- Be able to produce a lesson plan that shows good practice using technology
- Understand how they can implement active teaching methods in line with the College teaching strategy. The workshop resources and exercises support this as they are i.e based on the conversational framework (acquisition, collaboration, practice, produce, discuss)
