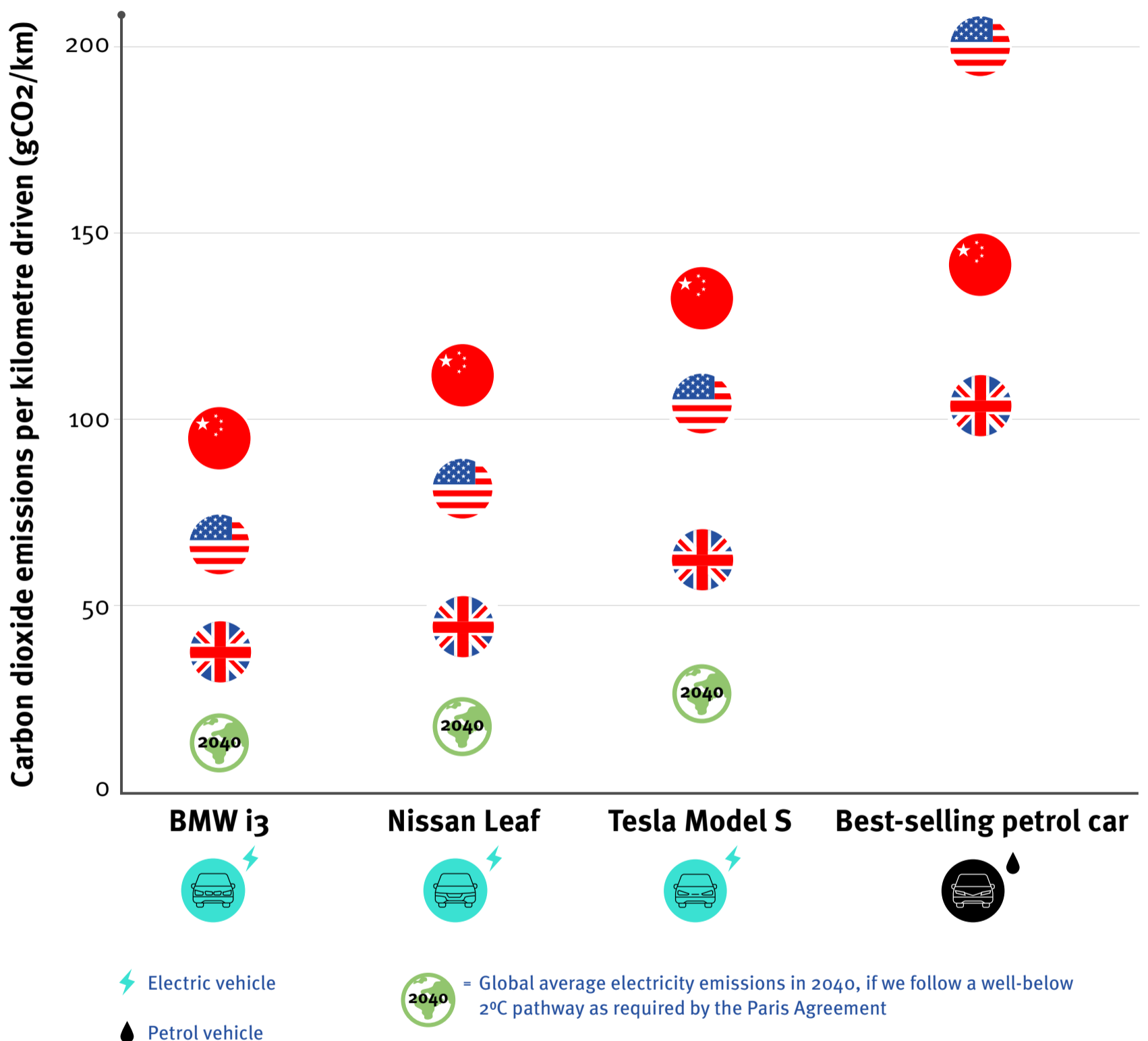


Q: Is it better for the climate to drive an electric car?

A: In 2018, all electric cars emit less carbon dioxide per kilometre than best-selling petrol vehicles.

This infographic shows how much of the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide is produced by driving an electric car one kilometre. While this varies depending on the electricity mix in the country in which it is charged, it compares favourably to the best-selling conventional cars in those countries.
