Background

- Mentoring is a widely used development tool that can have a beneficial impact on:
 - effectiveness
 - confidence
 - career advancement
- Following the success of mentoring in the Faculty of Medicine, a new scheme for all professional, technical and operational services staff is due to launch later this month.

Preparation for scheme launch

- Mentors from across College have been recruited & trained.
- A new mentor database has been developed to allow mentees to access mentors from across the college, giving access to a wide range of experiences and job roles.
- When the scheme opens, mentors and mentees will be matched and administrators will keep regular contact to check that matches are successful and that both parties finding meetings productive.

Get involved!

- We need more mentors, particularly from a technical background!
- All mentors attend a half-day workshop to:
 - help clarify what mentoring is (and isn't)
 - equip them with knowledge, skills and practical tools for building and sustaining effective mentoring relationships
 - focus on each of the key phases of the mentoring relationship (beginning, middle and ending) and become familiar with practical tools to help facilitate the mentoring process.
