### 1. Welcome and apologies (NH)

## 2. Minutes and matters arising from the last meeting (NH)

- The minutes of the last meeting were deemed to be an accurate record of discussions.
- Actions from the last meeting were considered. It was noted that:

## Naming of technicians in research publications

Since Professor Nick Jennings would be leaving College, work on this thread would be paused for the time being. In the meantime, Steering Group members should continue to share examples with AHR of technicians being named in publications. (Action: All)

## 3. Feedback on Technician Commitment submission (NH)

- NH reported that Imperial had received very encouraging feedback from the Technician Commitment peer review process on its December 2020 submission.
- It was agreed that NH would share an update with the Provosts' Office and that AHR would engage with Comms to develop a news story. (Action NH, AHR)

### 4. Support Services Committee (NH)

- NH advised that she had delivered a presentation on the Technician Commitment to the Support Services Committee in April and that attendees been supportive of the initiative.
- A key action would be to engage with Andrew Tebbutt and the Student Recruitment and Outreach team, who were keen to involve technicians with some of their activity. NH reported that she and AHR had a meeting planned soon with Andrew to explore opportunities for collaboration. (Action NH, AHR)

## 5. Plans for Technicians' Network summer event 2021 (AHR)

- AHR reported that plans were underway for a week-long virtual programme of conference sessions and career development workshops for the technical community, to take place in late June / early July 2021. The conference sessions would be themed around EDI and Sustainability.
- Concerns were expressed that, even with 'bite-sized' sessions, technicians might struggle to participate. It was agreed that NH would circulate the programme to Deans and FOOs and ask them to encourage their technicians to participate. (Action NH)
- A request was made for a physical space to be provided, for technicians based on campus who wanted to join the conference session away from their desks.
   (Action: AHR)

#### 6. Update from Institutional Leads Group (SS)

- SS provided an update from the Summer Term Institutional Leads Group meeting. She
  reported that several new institutions had joined the group. Progress on the submission
  for peer review of Technician Commitment impact reports and phase 2 action plans
  varied across members.
- The group had agreed that two cross-institutional networking events would be held each year, in the Autumn (September) and in the Spring. These would be virtual events for the foreseeable future.

• There had been discussions on secondment opportunities, work shadowing and changes to the professional registration application process.

## 7. Update on apprenticeships (AHR)

- AHR advised the group that three appointments had been made for the 2021 intake of
  engineering technician apprentices (one electronic and two mechanical). Recruitment
  would begin shortly for the first intake of laboratory technicians (two places) and for
  the new maintenance technician apprenticeship scheme within Estates (two places).
- NH said that the timing had not been suitable for the Faculty of Medicine to participate
  in the pilot laboratory technician apprenticeship scheme, but she hoped that they would
  come onboard in future. SS said that she would keep this on the agenda with fellow
  Senior Laboratory Managers within the Faculty and would be very interested to hear
  how the pilot progressed.

## 8. Update on professional registration (AHR)

- AHR told the group that this year's programme of support for science technicians to undertake professional registration was underway, in collaboration with Stephen Franey (Science Council Applicant Support Mentor). AHR explained that the Science Council were no longer able to resource face-to-face assessments, unless applicants had a particular need, due to a shortage of assessors. AHR was concerned that this would impact negatively on the number of applications made.
- NH asked AHR to explore whether a call could be made internally for assessors among our own technician professional registrants. (Action AHR)
- AHR advised the group that she had identified an individual, with a broad experience
  of professional registration for engineers, to work with a group of engineering
  technicians, mirroring the support provided to science technicians by Stephen Franey.
  She hoped to be able to share further details at the next meeting.

## 9. AOB (NH)

• AW told the group about her EDI seed fund project on mental health awareness in relation to students from Black, Asian and Ethnic Minority (BAME) communities. Five technicians had attended a workshop.
